# Temple of Mercy Ministry Covenant

*The Divine Creator of the Heavens and Earth Aka "The Great Mind", by its sovereign grace and omnipotent love alone, has led me to repent of my transgressions and believe in redemption. As one who has been baptized with the Holy Spirit as a believer in The Divine Creator of the Heavens and Earth, I desire to unite with this spiritual family. Therefore, I enter into a covenantal relationship with the members of this Temple. In humble reliance upon the Holy Spirit, I endeavor to pursue the following:*

- (1) To meet together for any and all worship services and classes, to serve and glorify The Divine Creator with my deeds and actions, to edify one another, and to work together for the good of The Temple.
- (2) To diligently guard the truth, upholding the standard of sound words recorded in Scripture and reflected in our Tenants of Faith.
- (3) To earnestly seek to unite with The Divine Creator in prayer both private and corporate for the pleasure of its presence, the needs of the righteous, for personal cleansing from transgressions, and for personal revival.
- (4) To avoid participation in any secret society which violates the Holy Scriptures (Bible, Quran, Husia, etc.) or our Tenants of Faith.
- (5) To wholeheartedly support, love, and care for the Temple's Ministries and members, offering: my prayers, my financial gifts of tithes and offerings, my service.
- (6) To boldly witness for God, living a transformed life and proclaiming the word of God as the Ministers guide my steps.
- (7) To actively pursue personal holiness before The Divine Creator in fulfillment of the great commandment – to love The Divine Creator supremely and my neighbor as The Divine Creator has loved us.
- (8) To promote the unity of the Temple, being a peacemaker with all in the body of The Divine Creator.
- (9) To respectfully follow the elders and other leaders of this Temple, trusting and supporting their leadership as they lead in Christ Consciousness.
- (10) To humbly submit to the Temple's discipline, graciously repenting when approached about personal sin, and lovingly restoring others who become entangled in sin if they should come to repentance
- (11) To be active in the work of the ministries of the local temple, unless providentially hindered

- (12) I also purpose to maintain family and private worship; if The Divine Creator has given me children, to train my children according to the Holy Scriptures (Bible, Quran, Husia, etc.), to walk carefully in the world, to be just in my dealings, faithful in my engagements, and appropriate in my conduct, to avoid gossip, not speaking that which is evil, and to avoid unrighteous anger, to abstain from all forms of activity which dishonor myself, my association with The Divine Creator, and this Temple cause stumbling to a fellow member or hinder bringing a soul to the Temple, to be zealous in my efforts to advance the cause of The Divine Creator, and to give it preeminence in all things.
- (13) I also purpose to guard the sanctity of life, as well as the scriptural structure of the family— (Man, Woman and Child) affirming marriage as that being between a man and a woman joined together by The Divine Creator, which man should not put asunder.
- (14) I further purpose to encourage my fellow brethren and sister in the blessed hope of redemption, to watch over one another in brotherly/sisterly love, to remember each other in prayer, to aid each other in sickness and distress, to cultivate sympathy in feelings and courtesy in speech, to be slow to take offense, but always ready for reconciliation.
- (15) I moreover purpose that if I am remove from this Temple or leave on my own accord, I will seek to unite with some other Church, Temple or Mosque of like faith and practice where I can carry out the spirit of this covenant and other principles of The Divine Creator's Word.

*This covenant I make in the presence of The Almighty Divine Creator, the Searcher of all hearts, with a true intention to fulfill my obligations, as I shall answer at the Last Day, when the secrets of all hearts shall be disclosed. I most humbly beseech The Divine Creator to strengthen me by The Holy Spirit for this end, and for its glory and honor.*



# Tenants of Faith

*The following is an abbreviated summary of our doctrinal statement.*

## 1. Of the Scriptures

We believe that the Holy Bible was written by men as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit, and is the perfect treasure of heavenly instruction (1); that it has God for its author, salvation for its end (2), and truth without any mixture of error for its matter (3); that it reveals the principles by which God will judge us (4); and therefore is, and shall remain to the end of the world, the true center of Spiritual union (5), and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and opinions should be tried (6).

## 2. Of the True God

We believe that there is one, and only one, living and true God, an infinite, intelligent Spirit, the Maker and Supreme Ruler of heaven and earth (1); inexpressibly glorious in holiness (2), and worthy of all possible honor, confidence, and love (3); that in the unity of the Godhead there are three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost (4); equal in every divine perfection (5), and executing distinct but harmonious offices in the great work of redemption (6).

## 3. Of the Fall of Man

We believe that man was created in holiness, under the law of his Maker (1); but by voluntary transgression fell from that holy and happy state (2); in consequence of which all people are now sinners (3), not by constraint, but choice (4); being by nature utterly void of that holiness required by the law of God, positively inclined to evil; and therefore under just condemnation to eternal ruin (5), without defense or excuse (6).

#### 4. Of the Way of Redemption

We believe that the salvation of sinners is wholly of grace (1), through the mediatorial offices of the Son of God (2); who by the appointment of the Father, freely took upon him our nature of sinful flesh (3); honored the divine law by his personal obedience (4), condemned sin in the flesh, and by his death made a full atonement for his sinful flesh (5); and uniting in his wonderful person the tenderest sympathies with divine perfections, he is in every way qualified to be a suitable, a compassionate, and an all-sufficient Savior (6).

#### 5. Of Justification

We believe that the great gospel blessing which Christ (1) secures to such as believe in him is justification (2); that justification includes the pardon of sin (3), and the promise of eternal life on principles of righteousness (4); that it is bestowed, not in consideration of any works of righteousness which we have done, but solely through faith in the Redeemer's life (5); by virtue of which faith his perfect righteousness is freely imputed to us of God (6); that it brings us into a state of most blessed peace and favor with God, and secures every other blessing needful for time and eternity (7).

#### 6. Of Repentance and Faith

We believe that repentance and faith are sacred duties, and also inseparable graces, wrought in our souls by the regenerating Spirit of God (1); whereby being deeply convinced of our guilt, danger, and helplessness, and of the way of salvation by Christ (2), we turn to God with unfeigned contrition, confession, and supplication for mercy (3); at the same time heartily receiving the Lord Jesus Christ as our Prophet, Priest, and King, and relying on him alone as the only and all-sufficient Savior (4).

We believe that only those who endure unto the end are true believers (1); that their persevering attachment to Christ is the grand mark which distinguishes them from superficial professors (2); that a special providence watches over their welfare (3); and they are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation (4).

## **8. Of the Harmony of the Universal Laws, The Principles of Maat, and The Ten Commandments**

We believe that the law of God is the eternal and unchangeable rule of his moral government (1); that it is holy, just, and good (2); and that the inability which the Scriptures ascribe to fallen men to fulfill its precepts arises entirely from their love of sin (3); to deliver them from which, and to restore them through a Mediator to unfeigned obedience to the holy law, is one great end of the gospel, and of the means of grace connected with the establishment of the visible church (4).

## **9. Of a Righteous Church**

We believe that a visible Church of Christ is a congregation of baptized believers (1), associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the gospel (2); observing the ordinances of Christ (3); governed by his laws (4), and exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by his Word (5); that its only scriptural officers are pastors and elders, and deacons (6), whose qualifications, claims, and duties are defined in the letters to Timothy and Titus.

## **10. Of Prayer and Fasting**

We believe that Christian baptism is the immersion in water of a believer (1), unto the name of the Father, and Son, and Holy Spirit (2); to show forth, in a solemn and beautiful emblem, our faith in the crucified, buried, and risen Savior, with its effect in our death to sin and resurrection to a new life (3); and that baptism is the visible sign of membership in the Body of Christ (4). We believe that in the Lord's Supper, believers in Jesus, by the sacred use of bread and wine, are to commemorate together the dying love of Christ (5); preceded always by solemn self-examination (6).

### **11. Of the Sabbath Day**

We believe that the first day of the week is the Lord's Day (1) and is to be kept sacred to religious purposes (2) by preparation for that rest that remains for the people of God (3).

### **13. Of the World to Come**

We believe that the end of the world is approaching (1); that at the last day Christ will descend from heaven (2), and raise the dead from the grave to final retribution (3); that a solemn separation will then take place (4); that the wicked will be adjudged to endless punishment, and the righteous to endless joy (5); and that this judgment will fix forever the final state of men in heaven or hell, on principles of righteousness (6).
